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Introduction

Beginning July 2022, Wickenburg Community Hospital (WCH) in partnership with the Town of Wickenburg, Wickenburg Chamber of Commerce, and the Wickenburg Unified School District and Wickenburg Ranch Lifestyles Team began conducting a comprehensive, region-wide Community Health Needs Assessment.

A Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) is defined as:

The ongoing process for a hospital to evaluate the health needs of its region-wide service area which, facilitates a prioritization of needs and develops strategies to address them.

Our purpose for conducting the CHNA was to:

- ✓ Define self-identified health status of our regional members
- ✓ Discover self-identified barriers to accessing health care
- ✓ Outline the type of services regional members are using
- ✓ Recognize a consensus definition that would constitute a healthy community
- ✓ Identify major health challenges
- ✓ Determine what would improve access to health care throughout the region

CHNA outcomes were used to develop strategies to address region-wide population health improvement in collaboration with our community partners and residents.

It is our great pleasure to integrate CHNA strategies into our long-term operational strategic plan as it supports our vision to be the world-class health and wellness leader for all communities served.

About the Geographic Region

WCH serves Wickenburg and surrounding rural communities within approximately 3,300 square miles between Surprise, Arizona and the Prescott Valley, including Highway 93 – a major thoroughfare to Las Vegas, Nevada – and down HWY 60 West to HWY 72.

Wickenburg Overview:

Community:

Wickenburg is a community of 7,359 located in the northwest corner of Maricopa County Arizona which is also home to the Phoenix/Scottsdale metropolitan area.

Residents are proud of their western heritage. Wickenburg is also home to a reported 3,000 'snowbirds' who temporarily make the area their home annually during the winter season.

Wickenburg is considered the 18th out of 120 best places to retire in Arizona according to niche.com. This may account for the high median age of residents: 64.2 years.

According to Cathy Weiss, Del E. Web Center for the Performing Arts CEO, Wickenburg has three lures that attract retirees:

- A museum
- A performing arts center
- A hospital

People love the area's climate, friendly small-town feel, and close proximity to Phoenix attractions when needed, but prefer not going to the valley (i.e., Phoenix).

The population of Wickenburg is expected to grow to 14,596 by 2030.

History of Wickenburg, Arizona

Words like tradition and authenticity aren't just jargon and babble in Wickenburg. We are tradition. We are authentic. And Wickenburg fills a glorious chapter in the history of Arizona and the West. Though less than an hour away (54 freeway miles) from the hustle and bustle of modern Phoenix, Arizona's most western community stands guarded from the metropolitan masses.

After all, Mother Nature herself kissed Wickenburg. Resting on the northern edge of the Sonoran Desert, just below Arizona's mountainous country, the Wickenburg area abounds in natural beauty. Stoic saguaros. Shadow mountains. Lush desert flanking the river. And while the area's geological treasures attracted the miners from around the world, the Hassayampa River flood plain provided fertile soil for **farming and ranching**.

For centuries, the western Yavapai (or Tolkapaya as they called themselves), made the banks of this oasis their home, irrigating their crops of corn, beans, squash, and tobacco with river water. They named this place Haseyamo, "following the water as far as it goes," from which the word Hassayampa derived. Though within the claimed territories, neither the Spanish Empire nor the Mexican Republic ever extended their authority this far north. However, **Hispanic culture and trade** did reach the Yavapai tribe which was Wickenburg's first family.



In the early 1820's, stalwart **hunters and trappers** explored the Hassayampa River in search of beavers, whose pelts were sold to hat makers back east and in Europe. Their reports helped pique American interest in the West. The Wickenburg area and much of the West became part of the United States following the Mexican American War in 1848.

An 1862 gold strike on the Colorado River near present-day Yuma inspired hardy prospectors and miners, predominantly from California and Mexico, to search for minerals throughout central Arizona. The names of these Argonauts now grace many of the surrounding geographic

landmarks, including the Weaver Mountains and Peeple's Valley.

Among the gold searches was the adventurer, **Henry Wickenburg**. He came from far-off lands, lured by the dream of abundant gold. His quest was rewarded by the discovery of the Vulture Mine, where over \$30 million in gold has been dug from the ground. Throughout the foothills surrounding Wickenburg are relics of other mines that stand as a tribute to the **pioneer miner and prospector**. The mining lore of the region, past and present, adds much to the charm of the area.

Ranchers and farmers who built homes along the fertile plain of the Hassayampa River accompanied the miners. Many of the resourceful and



committed settlers came from Sonora, Mexico, giving this area the distinction of being the northern edge of the Hispanic ranching frontier. Together with Henry Wickenburg and the miners, they helped found the young community of Wickenburg in 1863.

The infant town went through many trials and tribulations in those first decades, surviving Indian wars, mine closures, desperadoes, drought, and a disastrous flood in 1890 when the Walnut Creek Dam burst, killing nearly 70. Through it all, the town continued to grow. Its prosperity was issued with the coming of the railroad in 1895. The historic depot still stands today as the Wickenburg Chamber of Commerce and Visitor's Center.

Along the town's main historic district, early businesses built beautiful structures that still grace Wickenburg's downtown area. The abundant clean air and wide-open spaces attracted a whole new and exciting aspect of the Wickenburg neighborhood. **Guest ranches** offered a unique western experience to tourists who fell in love with the West. The Bar FX Ranch became the first true guest ranch in 1923, followed by the Remudas, Kay El Bar, Rancho de los Caballeros, and Flying E ranches, just to mention a few. The construction of the Phoenix to California highway (Highway 60) brought even more tourists, making Wickenburg the Dude Ranch Capital of the World. Today, some of these ranches still offer their unique brand of Western hospitality and are among the reasons True West Magazine recognized Wickenburg among the 10 best Western towns in the world.

The Hassayampa community became a vital contributor to America's patriotic war effort during World War II when the US Army trained thousands of men to fly gliders at a newly constructed airfield west of Wickenburg. After the War, **modern pioneers and home builders** developed Wickenburg into a splendid



American community. Wickenburg of today is a modern town with over 600 businesses providing a full range of accommodations, services, shopping, conveniences, specialty shops and galleries for gifts of western distinction.

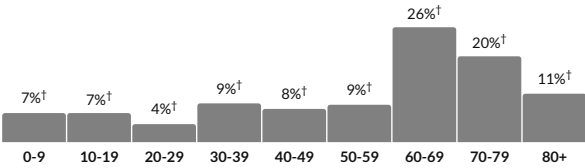

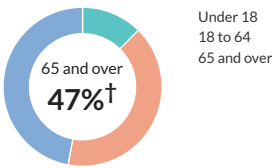

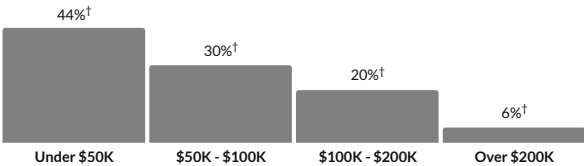

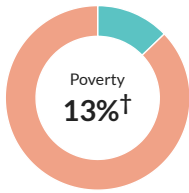

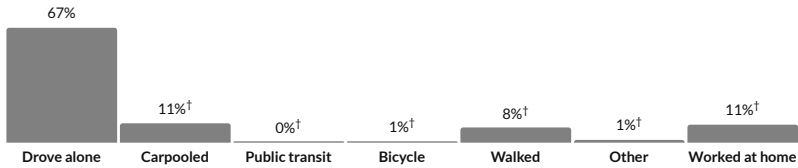

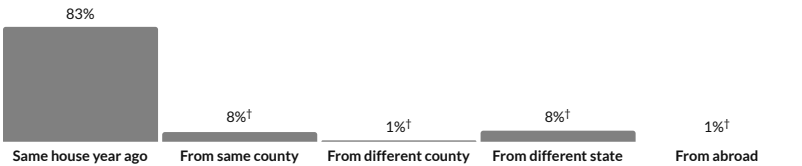

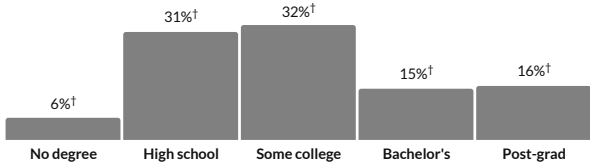

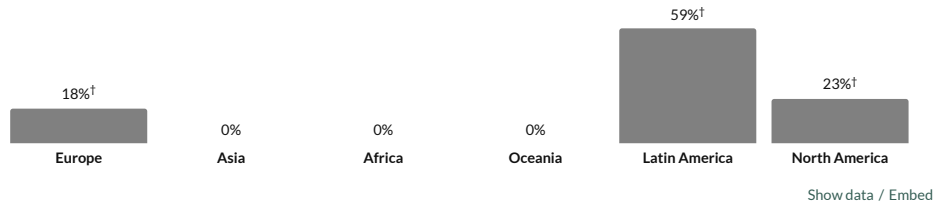

Place of birth for foreign-born population



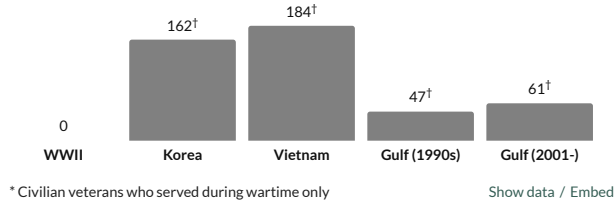

Veterans by wartime service



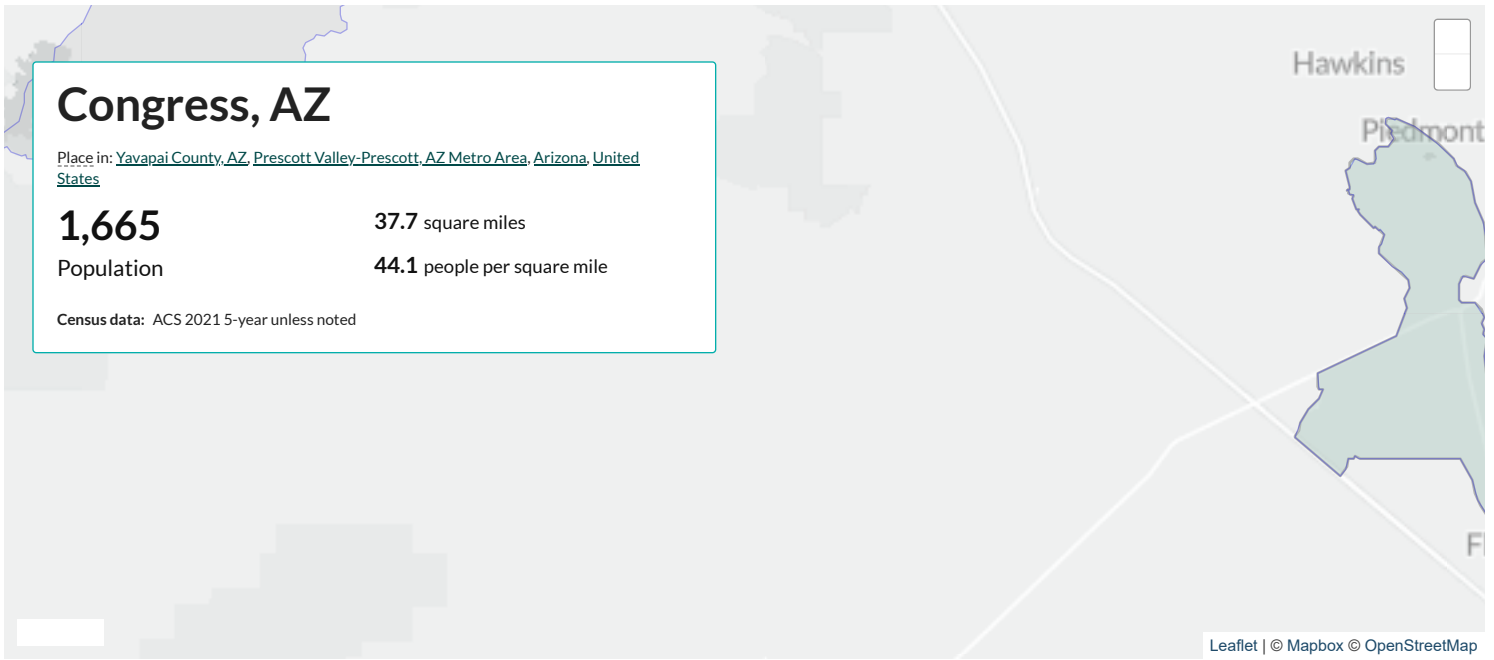

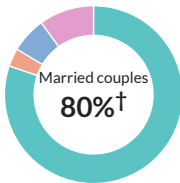

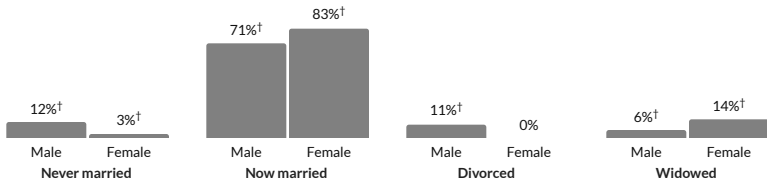

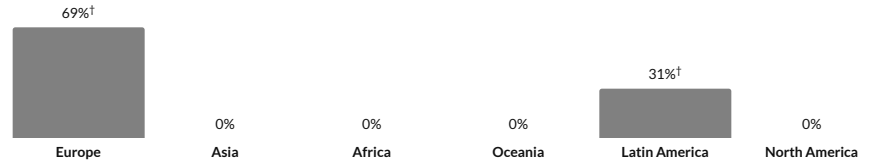

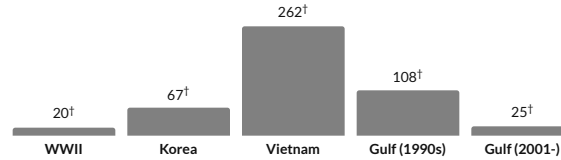

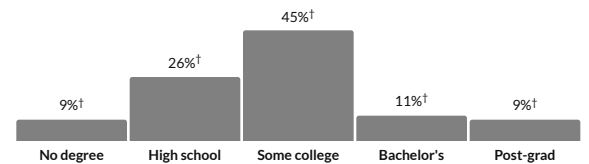

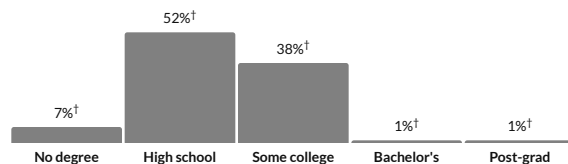

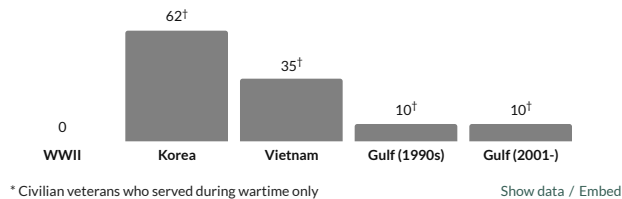

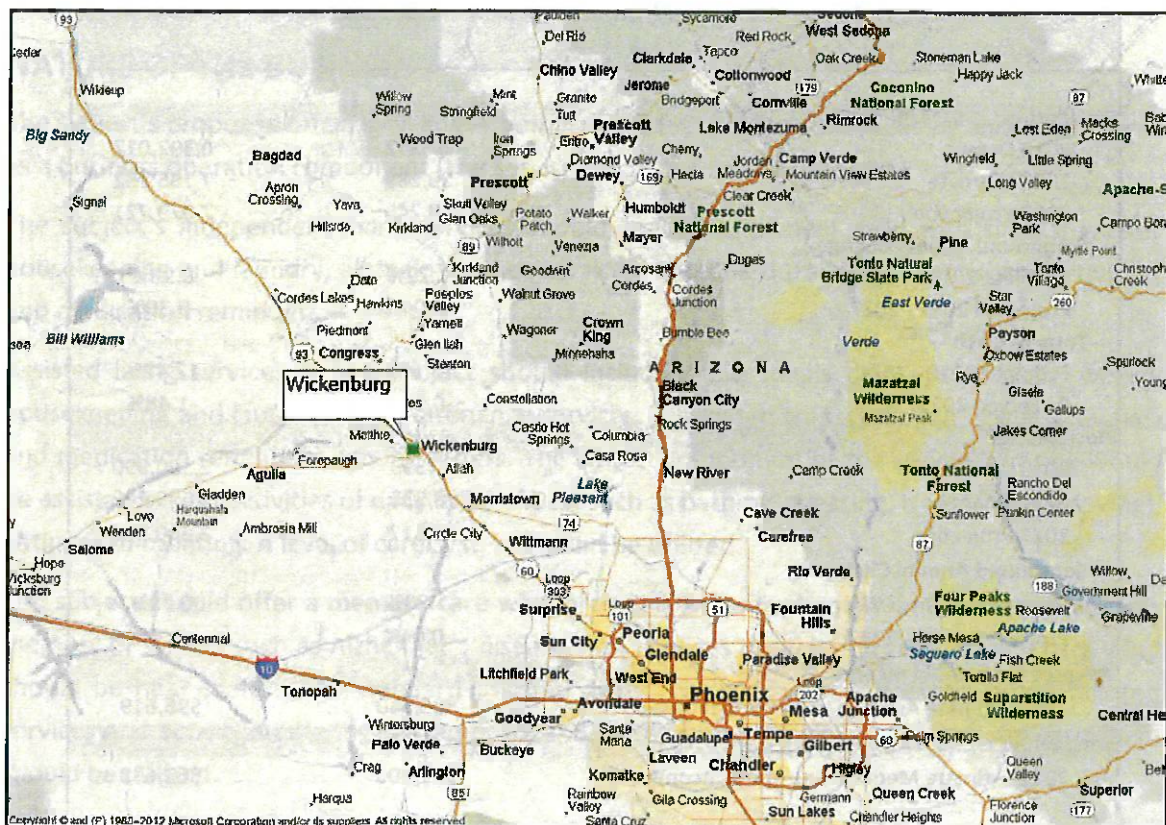

LOCATION MAP

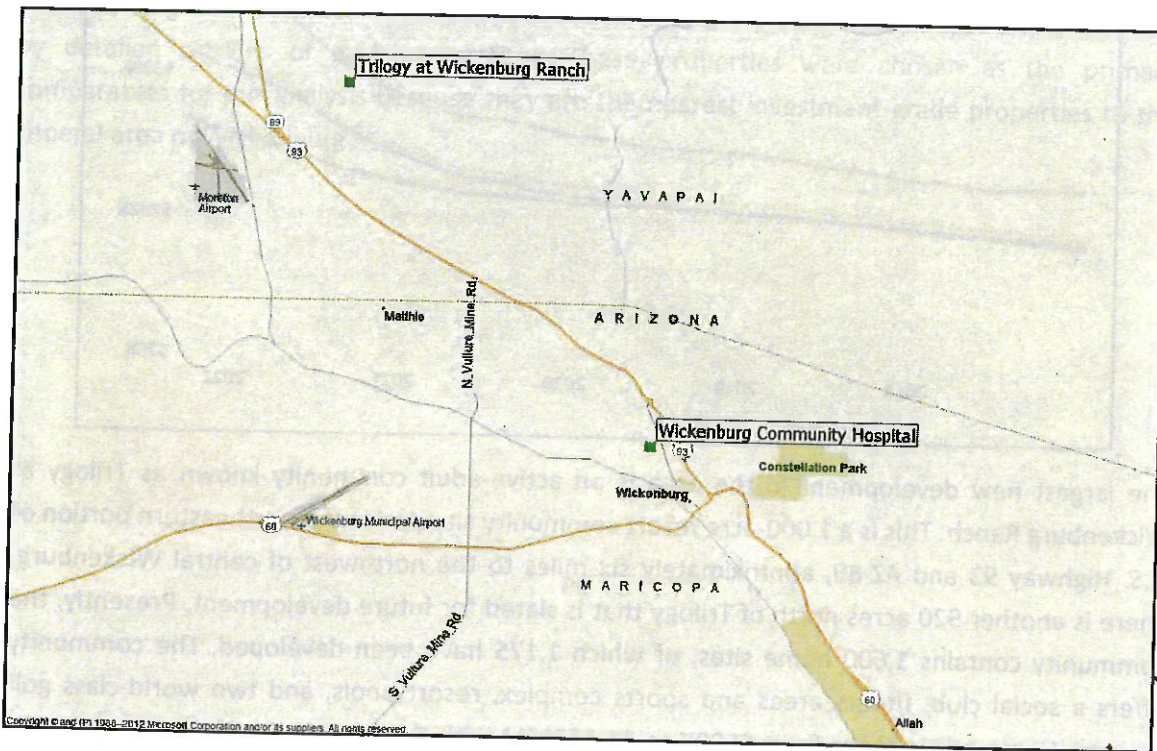


As shown above, Wickenburg is situated approximately 65-miles northwest of Phoenix and 60-miles southwest of Prescott.

The local area consists of the Wickenburg's city limits, which are denoted in the following map.

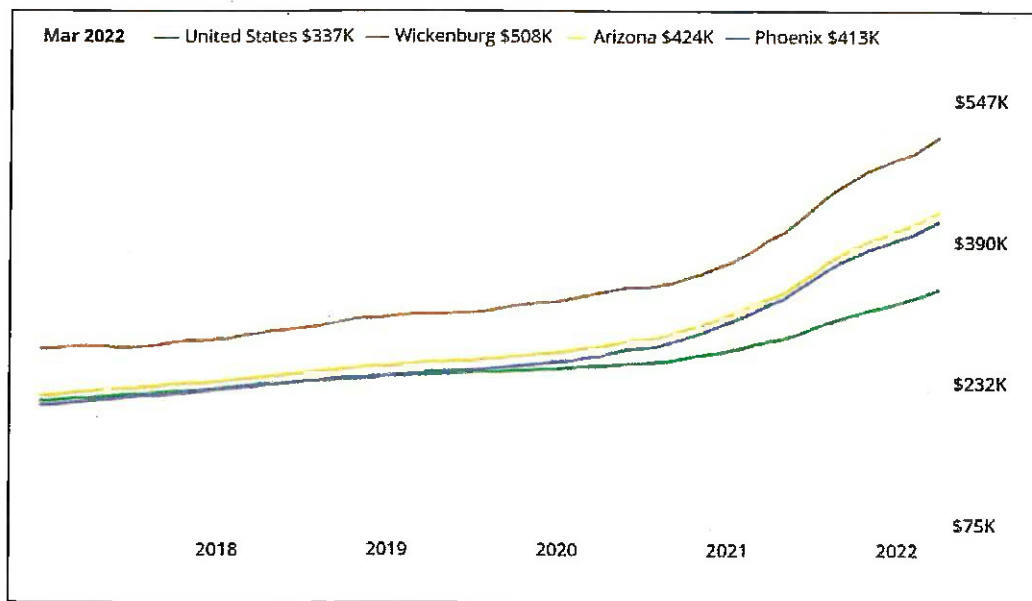
LOCAL AREA MAP



AREA CHARACTERISTICS

Based on our review of the area, the local area is in the mature stage of development as residential land uses are located mostly along secondary and tertiary roadways with local businesses and commercial uses concentrated along the primary and secondary traffic routes. The two main commercial roadways are Wickenburg Way (U.S. highway 60) and U.S. Highway 93. These are also the two regional roadways providing direct access to Prescott to the northeast and Phoenix to the southeast. The majority of the city's population lives within a one-mile radius from the center of Wickenburg. The area is served by Wickenburg Community Hospital. The hospital underwent a \$10 million expansion in 2016. It is a State designated Level IV trauma center with 19 beds including an eight-bed emergency room.

According to Zillow, the Zillow Home Value Index for Wickenburg hovers above the greater Phoenix market and state. As shown in the following graph, the value index for Wickenburg has increased by roughly 25% from the \$400K range in April 2021 to \$508K as of March 2022. This is indicative more affluent, wealthier residents moving to the market seeking the more Southwestern lifestyle.



The largest new development in the area is an active-adult community known as Trilogy at Wickenburg Ranch. This is a 1,000-acre resort community situated in the northeastern portion of U.S. Highway 93 and AZ-89, approximately six miles to the northwest of central Wickenburg. There is another 920 acres north of Trilogy that is slated for future development. Presently, the community contains 1,600 home sites, of which 1,175 have been developed. The community offers a social club, fitness areas and sports complex, resort pools, and two world-class golf courses. Home prices range from \$599K to \$1,163MM with the median list price at \$697K. We spoke with a sales representative that stated most of the residents are of retirement age and coming in from California, as well as from Phoenix. They also get residents from the Prescott and Flagstaff areas that have difficulty living in higher altitudes. The representative believes a senior living community would do very well in this market given the number of retirees flocking to the area.

SUMMARY

Overall, it appears the Wickenburg market is well suited for senior living development. There are enough local supportive land uses in place to support such a use. The area has become a draw for retiree-aged residents via Trilogy at Wickenburg Ranch and the affordable ranch lifestyle. Based on this, the area should be able to support a new senior living community.

Process/Methodology

Wickenburg Community Hospital & Clinics' (WCH) development of the CHNA survey process began by forming the 2022 Project Team in November 2021. The Team decided to utilize the survey used in the 2019 CHNA as the primary data source. The Team kept 33 of the original 2019 survey questions and modified an additional 13 to capture a wider range of data. It was agreed the questions upheld value and diverse standards into issues most likely relevant to the regional population. Also, in agreement amongst the Team, was to evaluate 2022 data together with 2019 and 2016 data. This would facilitate a comprehensive overview to aid in prioritization of needs and strategies to address them.

The survey was created in both English and in Spanish. WCH and each community partner distributed and collected the survey digitally, online and/or by paper if requested to their clients, employees, families, and other community members throughout the region. Also, Wickenburg Community Hospital published display ads in the town newspaper to garner additional survey participation. In all cases and by all methods of distribution, respondents remained anonymous.

Surveys data was collected both online through Survey Monkey and available by paper. Paper surveys were entered manually into Survey Monkey to organize the information.

Secondary data considered included results collected from the patient satisfaction surveys as well as in person conversations between staff and patients of WCH.

The Team met to review, discuss, and analyze survey results. Following, the Team outlined areas of prioritization and developed strategies to address them. The proposed CHNA Strategic Plan may be found at the end of this report.

Three Public Health Priorities for the Maricopa County Community Health Improvement Plan

Priority Areas and Goal

1. **Access to Care:** To increase access to quality, comprehensive health and wrap around services.
2. **Access to Healthy Food:** To increase access to health food.
3. **Early Childhood Development:** To improve early childhood experiences.

Analysis

Respondents – 298 respondents participated in the 2022 assessment. Participation increased by 83 respondents over 2019, and 91 more than 2016 participation. Of note, the relative low respondent rate, though increasing, is of concern. Of the members who completed the survey identified themselves as residents of: 71.87% in Wickenburg, 4.53% in Morristown, 4.53% in Yarnell, 4.18% in Congress and the remainder lived in various rural towns inside the WCH service area.

Self-identified Health Status – of the 248 respondents who described their health status, 90.73% reported being in *good or very good health*. Of concern, 9.27% of respondents reported their health status as *fair to poor*. Of the 217 respondents who identified a disease or health problem, 93.55% reported suffering from pain (bone or joint, back or neck, arthritis, or mobility), 30.88% reported hypertension, 13.82% reported heart disease, and 5.99% report cancer. Of 241 respondents, 67.22% feel overweight, obese, or very obese.

WCH provides health care services for pain and other health concerns through rehabilitation services, interventional pain management, orthopedic services, and nutrition services. Of note, regional awareness of such services is of concern.

Self-identified Barriers to Accessing Healthcare – 239 respondents did not provide an answer to this question. However, of the 50 respondents who did, 62% reported their insurance did not cover medical care and they could not afford to pay, 26% stated they could not find a provider taking new patients, 24% stated not knowing where to go or if the service was available and 12% reported the office was not open when they could schedule an appointment.

WCH has a mission to meet the 501r guidelines and the community need through the provision of financial assistance for medically necessary “voice recorded interpretation” based on CMS guidelines and services healthcare in a fair, consistent, respectful, and objective manner to low-income patients who do not have insurance coverage or the ability to pay Co-Pays or Coinsurance or Deductibles. We do not discriminate or deny care to anyone based on inability to pay or financial circumstances.

Community Awareness about health services – of the 260 respondents who answered this question 61.92% stated word of mouth, 32.69% website/internet, 27.31% healthcare provider, 24.23% search engine (Google, Bing, etc...) and 21.15% say newspaper.

WCH utilizes a wide range of community awareness strategies including digital and print media, community event engagement with partners such as the Wickenburg Chamber of Commerce, Rotary of Wickenburg, and Town of Wickenburg city council.

Use of Services – of 257 respondents seeking medical care for themselves or a family member, 79.77% visited a doctor’s office or clinic, 55.64% visited a pharmacy, 45.91% visited a hospital (ER, outpatient, inpatient, labor/delivery) and 12.84% visited an urgent care facility. Of the 226 respondents, 74.80% received medical care in Wickenburg, 15.04% in Phoenix, and 4.87% in Prescott and 4.42% to other hospitals outside Arizona. 90.68% of 236 respondents or a family member received care from a specialty provider. Of the specialty providers, 37.26% to a dermatologist, 35.85% went to a dentist, 33.02 % to a cardiologist, 24.53% to an ophthalmologist, 22.64% to an orthopedic surgeon, and 16.04% to a physical therapist.

WCH provides the above indicated health care services through programs or agreements with specialty providers.

Definition of a Healthy Community – of the 214 respondents, 48.13% reported *low crime and safe neighborhoods, affordable housing* (47.2%), *good jobs and a healthy economy* (42.99%), and *healthy behaviors and lifestyles* (38.79%) define a healthy community.

WCH is the largest employer in Wickenburg, employing 231 full-time employees and 49 part-time employees. Full-time employees may choose to “opt-in” to health care benefits for themselves and/or their families.

Top 5 Major Health Challenges – of 208 respondents, 73.08% reported aging problems, 47.60% availability of medical services, 40.38% heart disease/stroke, 29.81% Obesity, and 29.33% dementia/Alzheimer’s disease.

WCH serves a growing retirement community where additional “medical services” needs to be more clearly defined in order to assess regional health challenges.

What Would Improve Access to Healthcare – of the 198 respondents, 73.23% reported a need for more primary care providers, 66.16% reported a need for more specialty care providers, and 47.47% reported a need to improve Quality of Life.

Secondary data reported transportation to healthcare related services is of concern for members of the more rural areas outside the Wickenburg town limits.

WCH administration assesses patient to provider/specialty provider ratio on an ongoing basis to meet the growing healthcare need of the region. More attention is needed to develop a program to guide further lifestyle quality improvements in partnership with other community programs.

Strategic Plan

Respondents - Project Team should engage more community members in recruiting individuals to complete the next survey. A more strategic and direct approach will be developed to encourage survey engagement for the 2025 survey. The 2025 CHNA Team will meet in November of 2024 to strategize.

Self-identified Health Status - Project Team recommends an evaluation of internal referral procedures to identify areas of improvement regarding pain management, hypertension, heart disease, cancer care and healthy weight management. Evaluation should include but not be limited to clinic providers, referral specialist, registration personnel, and telephone operators.

Self-identified Health Status - Project Team recommends an evaluation of internal referral procedures to identify areas of improvement in regard to pain management, hypertension, heart disease, cancer care and healthy weight management. Evaluation should include but not be limited to clinic providers, referral specialist, registration personnel, and telephone operators.

Self-identified Barriers to Accessing Health Care – Project Team should evaluate provider availability and confirm the insurance contracts secured with the organization include a large variety of payers. Team should also evaluate office hours and community awareness for finding services.

Community Awareness about health services – Project Team should conduct an evaluation of its community awareness efforts. The evaluation should focus on the organization's utilization of the top channels for awareness. The top five channels were identified as word of mouth, website information, provider referral, google searches, and finally local newspaper.

Use of Services – Project Team should continue to monitor use of health care services in future CHNAs, to ensure the services identified as needs in the community are made available to its members.

Definition of a Healthy Community – Project Team should continue to monitor the regional definition of a healthy community based on a consensus of survey responses in future CHNAs. Project team is monitoring for healthcare related identifiers and opportunities to improve community health.

Top 5 Major Health Challenges – Project Team should identify which healthcare services can be provided by the organization from the top five challenges: aging problems, availability of services, heart disease/stroke, obesity, and dementia/Alzheimer's disease.

What Would Improve Access to Health Care – Project Team recommends continued implementation of improvement practices from the robust patient and family experience program that has been developed. The program currently measures Hospital Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (HCAHPS) and patient satisfaction surveys. The program should continue to grow by adding peer-based and measurable action plans to improve quality that should result in better overall health outcomes for the patient. Patient satisfaction surveys currently monitor access to care and WCH management teams will utilize these results as they develop strategies for improving access to care.

The Project Team should identify ways to increase primary care and specialty care provider availability, which will in turn improve quality of life.
